SUMMARY (This summary is not meant to be written in the copy. It is only to read and understand.)

Beauty gives pleasure to all our senses. The poet is trying to say in this poem that beauty is in everything. All things are beautiful in their own unique way. The poet says that the real beauty can be seen in the sunlight, trees, and birds, in the corn growing, people working or people dancing for the harvest. The poet does not agree with the traditional thinking about beauty.

Now the poet is talking about how beauty can be heard. According to her, beauty can be heard at night when the wind sings and when the rain falls and when a singer sings in earnest from the core of his heart.

The poet says in the concluding stanza that beauty lies in ourselves; in good deeds, happy thoughts which are repeated in our dreams and in our work and even in our rest. Beauty is everywhere. It is in attitude, the way we look at things. Actually everything is beautiful in its own unique manner, it is just to feel the need of it.

QUESTION AND ANSWERS

Q1. The poet says" Beauty is heard" can you hear beauty? Add a sound that you think is beautiful to the sounds the poet thinks are beautiful.....

The poet, Keats, said:

Heard melodious are sweet

But those unheard are sweeter.

What do you think this means? Have you ever heard a song in your head, long after the song was sung or played?

Ans- We find the melodious notes of cuckoo or the nightingale very pleasing to the ears but that pleasure is still incomplete. We have models of perfect beauty in our imagination and we wait anxiously to hear our beloved voice and the chanting of prayers in holy places. We look for perfection. It is your inner mind that needs to be beautiful to find beauty in untold words.

Q2. Read the first and second stanza s of the poem. Note the following phrases.

Corn growing, people working or dancing, wind sighing, rain falling, a singer chanting

These could be written as

. Corn that is growing

.people who are working or dancing.

Can you rewrite the other phrases like this? Why do you think the poet uses the shorter phrases? Discuss with your partner what these lines mean.

Q3. Write a paragraph on beauty. Use your own ideas along with the poem ideas.
